The overall aim of the Dolpa Home is to provide a place for the children from the Himalayas where conditions are harsh and basic living is demanding. Children come from the poorest families or are orphans in great need and are put forward by the community for a place at the home where they have the chance of an education whilst our partners ensure they will retain their language and culture. The hope is they will eventually return to the Dolpa region and teach other children what they have learned and share their faith.

On 9th February the home had an open day during the New Year's festivities of Loshar. Many of the families and relatives of the children came to Kathmandu for the annual Buddhist celebrations and stayed in the Bodhanath area for nearly 2 months whilst it was very cold and snowing in their own villages. Dolpa Home sent buses to collect the

families for the home's open day gospel programme. They expected about 40 people but over 120 people came. This was a very enjoyable and exiting day for the children who had not seen their families and relatives for a long time and they performed a special programme which really touched them and many cried at the end of it. The home was shining like a bright light and the families were amazed at what the children had learned at the home and were full of praise.

School life had been severely disrupted during the year, with the borders to India closed and no fuel available for school transport. It was a difficult year and the children missed a lot of school. But the children worked really hard during that time and thankfully things are back to normal again now. Jomma and Pemba did amazingly well in their GCSE equivalent exams. Jomma achieved Grade A and Pemba achieved Grade B+ and this is really great news. They will now be able to get a place at college for the next 2 years. They still need to decide what subjects to take, depending on what they would like to do in the future. Pemba is interested in Hotel Management and Tourism and Jomma likes Economics but also would like to go to Bible College.
